What: Paid entry to the pumpkin patch includes: one free pumpkin, a wagon ride to and from the pumpkin patch, and admission to the corn maze, farm animals, and children's activities such as bale maze, bale pyramid, calf roping station, pedal tractor driving, and more! For a bit extra face painting, pony rides, fresh kettle corn, and other food and drinks are available.

What: Certified organic and pet friendly! Their annual corn maze is celebrating Equality this year! The farm features a hay maze, duck races, animal viewing and hay rides to the patch. On weekends, enjoy the cow and grain trains, haunted maze, face painting etc. Costumes are encouraged!

Friday and Saturday the farm is open until 10pm every weekend in October

Where: The Pumpkin Patch, 16511 NW Gillihan Rd. Portland, OR (Sauvie's Island)

What: Portland's Original Pumpkin Patch! Over 50 varieties of fruit and vegetables are grown on 800 acres. The Harvest Festival features a 1929 big red barn, the Patio café, and the produce market, hay rides, animal barn, and a corn maze celebrating Big Foot.

When: 10am - 6pm daily

Where: Roloff Farms, 23985 NW Grossen, Hillsboro, OR

What: Farm includes a wide variety of pumpkins (even blue and pink ones), a petting zoo, a gift barn, wagon tours, pony rides, face painting, adventure area, hay pyramid, kiddie train, spooky forest trail loop, tarantula track, corn-stalk maze, giant sling shots, obstacle course, teepee play area, and putt-putt golf.
